

The book of Jonah has always held a special place in my heart. When we started Adult Sunday School, Jonah was one of our first Bible studies. I think it is because in so many ways I have found myself able to identify with Jonah and his many shortcomings as a prophet for the Lord.

One character flaw that I share with the wayward prophet is a tendency to allow myself to get upset over comparatively trivial things. And like Jonah, I sometimes miss the big picture.

In our first lesson for September 18, Jonah is disappointed that God chose to be merciful to those nasty folks from Nineveh after they repented of their evil ways. Let me say that one more time. Jonah was disappointed that God was merciful! How ridiculous is that?

So Jonah goes outside of town to sit and wait and God appointed a bush to give him shade (which Jonah liked) and then the next day appointed a worm to attack and kill the bush (which Jonah hated.) And so Jonah asks to die because he is angry that the bush died. How petty can he get?

Oh, do you remember that part where I said that I sometimes identify with Jonah, especially his shortcomings? Ouch. The truth of the matter is when I look back on some of the things in my life that I have allowed to upset me, it is embarrassing. It is amazing the things that I allow myself to obsess over when

there are so many things in our world that are more deserving of my attention and energy.

For Jonah, the salvation of 120,000 people was not a cause for celebration. God's grace was something that should be reserved for certain folks who were more deserving. Jonah missed the memo that grace isn't grace if it is deserved.

Likewise, there are millions of people near and far who are facing challenges of drought, starvation, malaria, civil unrest, Alzheimer's, unemployment, cancer and so much more. There are some things that are beyond our control, but there are many things that we can do that will save actual lives.

Perhaps the most important way that we can identify with Jonah is the trust that somehow, some way. God manages to work through us regardless of our shortcomings and ultimately God's grace will triumph! Let us pray that we may have eyes to see the big picture and the will to act.

## Lutheran World Relief School Supply Drive

WOW! We filled 161 school bags last year and set a goal of 200 for this year. With two weeks to go, it is clear we will exceed the 200! Thanks to the generosity of the wholesaler that sent more bags than we ordered and excellent bag sewing by Vicki Pavlish over the summer, we actually have 254 bags! Can we fill even that many? The answer is "Yes"!

As of August 21, we have enough of everything but pencils (go figure!) for 230 kits, and if things come in on August 27 like they did on August 20, there will be very little left to buy after that. Most needed now: pens, 21 ten packs; pencils, 31 twelve packs; 30 scissors and 53 notebooks. We still need a few crayons and erasers but have plenty of sharpeners and rulers.

Please have all donations for this drive at the church no later than Sunday, September 3, so that we will have time to use donated funds to "even up" the supplies. Any remaining funds will be given to Lutheran World Relief to help with shipping costs.
