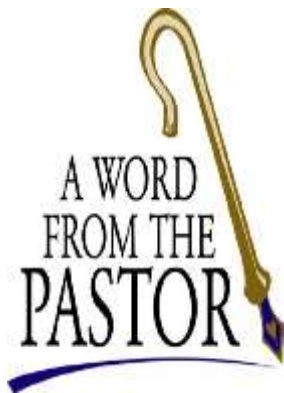
Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?"

And they answered him, "John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets."

He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah."

Mark 8:27-29

From the Gospel for September 15



I don't know if there is a more important question in all of life than the question that Jesus asks his disciples on the road to Philippi. "But who do you say that I am?"

Mark records the most concise reply of Peter, "You are the Christ." Luke's gospel records Peter saying answering, "The Christ (*Messiah*) of God." The writer of Matthew's gospel is the most detailed recording Peter's confession as, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Those of us who have grown up as part of a worshiping community have heard this text so many times that it becomes easy for us to hear it without letting it really speak to us. Or we treat it as a rhetorical question that doesn't require a response. However, this is a question that Jesus continues to ask his disciples of every generation.

Who do we say that Jesus is? We can say that he died for our sins and was raised from the dead and those things are true, but those things are things we say Jesus did, not who Jesus is. Who do we say that Jesus is?

In Martin Luther's explanation to the second article of the Apostles' Creed he writes, "I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, Son of the Father from eternity, and true man, born of the Virgin Mary – is my Lord. When we confess that Jesus is our Lord, we are confessing that our lives and our fates rest in his hands. Because we believe that he died for our sins and was raised to conquer the power of death we believe that he is our Lord and our Savior.

Because Jesus is our Lord and our Savior we gather as a family of faith to thank and praise and worship

him. Every week we gather to answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?"

Worship is so central to our life together that we want everyone to be able to participate and celebrate.

During September and October, the Adult Forum will be discussing End of Life Options dealing with ethics, morality, legal, medical, and personal/family wishes. We will view webinars, popular press articles, letters to editors, along with enough time for your thoughts, opinions, and discussion.

The University of Minnesota had a program on Considering Medical Aid in Dying this past spring. We will be viewing this program in three parts. Ten states have statutes that authorize medical aid in dying, first legalized in Oregon in 1994 where authorized doctors prescribe lethal medication that the patient may choose to take. Minnesota is debating similar legislation. The three presenters are experts on the law, ethics, and clinical realities of medical aid in dying. They bring different perspectives and disciplines to this important debate.

Campfire Conversations September 15 from 6:30-7:30!



Do you feel “we are so divided” these days? How would you define “we”? What social groups or communities are you a part of?

Consider family, friends, schoolmates, colleagues, church, neighborhood, municipality, state, country, etc. What issues are important to each of those? What issues divide those groups? What potentially divisive topics do you engage whilst with them? What topics do you actively avoid around them? How are your anxiety levels these days?

Divisions are wide, highlighted or deepened by Covid and partisan politics. Interested forces (or algorithmic ones) seem determined to highlight conflict and disagreement, rather than points of shared interest. This conversation names scripture's varying degrees of helpfulness, suggestions that we are not as divided as we are led to believe, and a run at gratitude as a unifying counter to resentment. The church hasn't exactly been devoid of division or grounded in gratitude. Let's work on that. What are you most grateful for these days, or right now? Spend a moment to imagine how gratitude could reshape ideological differences or impasses among divided people.
