

Moses said to the LORD, "Why have you treated your servant so badly? Why have I not found favor in your sight, that you lay the burden of all this people on me? Did I conceive all this people? Did I give birth to them, that you should say to me, 'Carry them in your bosom, as a nurse carries a sucking child,' to the land that you promised on oath to their ancestors? Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they come weeping to me and say, 'Give us meat to eat!' I am not able to carry all this people alone, for they are too heavy for me.

Numbers 11:11-14



I have a confession to make to you. On occasion, I have been guilty of sin that has plagued men and women whom God has called to serve God's people since the time of Moses. It is a sin that I first noticed while I was serving in my first call at the Three Point Parish of Bethany, Immanuel and Trinity Lutheran Churches in Cashton, Wisconsin.

I can say that through the help and support of many caring friends, I am catching myself much earlier than before, but it is ever there if I let my guard down. The sin of which I speak is the sin of trying to be responsible for every aspect of the life and ministry of the Church, and then getting upset with God when things do not get done or start to fall apart or do not go the way I envisioned them going.

For Moses, this frustration came to a head when, even though God had provided manna for the people to eat, they were not satisfied and wanted meat. The people started whining, "Remember how great it was when we were slaves in Egypt and all the great food we had?" This was too much for Moses and he throws a little tantrum before God, essentially saying, "What did I ever do to you that you would lay the burden of this people on me?"

However, Moses missed the point, just as every pastor and priest has missed it since that time. Namely, it is not about us and we were never meant to do it alone. God had Moses gather seventy elders

and place his spirit upon them so that they would all provide leadership and ministry in God's name serving God's people.

In the same way, God continues to call and empower people in God's church. At St. Philip's Lutheran Church, we are blessed with a gifted council and strong ministry teams that serve in the areas of worship, faith formation, stewardship, fellowship, human resources, finance, property care and technology. We also have devoted Sunday School and confirmation teachers, along with dedicated women and men who work to support the ministry of Hastings Family Service, Meals on Wheels, Food4Kids, Quilts and school kits for Lutheran World Relief, and many others!

Next month, on November 3, there will be a Ministry Opportunity Fair where our ministry teams and serving groups will share what is involved in their sphere of ministry. This is an outstanding opportunity to find a place where your talents and passions can connect with others while serving in and beyond our congregation. During this time, we each are called to look at how God is asking us to use and share our gifts and passions and talents.

Perhaps serving on one of our ministry teams appeals to you. You can help make decisions that impact our faith community. Most teams meet monthly, and it is rare for a meeting to exceed an hour. Maybe serving on a team doesn't appeal to you but you would like to plug in to a single event and serve there. Or maybe you feel drawn to a more "behind the scenes" ministries such as our altar guild, (after all those communion cups don't fill themselves,) or helping us with our social media presence, or keeping care of our building and grounds. There are also "once-a-year" opportunities such as serving on our audit team or nominating committee or as a synod assembly delegate. By investing yourself in our ministry, you will receive dividends in new friendships and a greater appreciation of all that God is doing in and through St. Philip's!

None of us can do this alone, and if we try, like Moses, we will quickly become overwhelmed. But when we all work together it is amazing what God has and will continue to do in us and through us! Thanks be to God!

St. Philip's volunteers sort through it and organize it by date to go out. Produce that looks a bit downtrodden and food that is expired is separated and now goes to a local pig farmer who is disposing of it by feeding it to his pigs. This is a win-win for everyone!

Thanks to all who are helping with this effort three Monday's a month. Four volunteers do the work with the assistance of one lead volunteer from our church. 


Conventional wisdom says, "Whatever you do, don't talk about politics or religion!" On October 20 we will be doing both. A spoiler on the title on whether Jesus is a Democrat or Republican (neither!), and whether our faith should inform how we vote (absolutely!) There was admittedly some incredulity when I introduced this topic. But this is why we need to talk about this: people assume we cannot. This is incorrect. And the inability to even talk about politics is hurting us as a people. Folks often comment on how "divided we are right now," but when presented with an opportunity to engage in healthy dialogue they often do not.

Politics is something we should be able to talk about especially in relation to our faith, but if you are thinking you are going to come and put someone in their place or get a political "win" out of it, please skip this one. If you think a guided dialogue might help you see our democracy and political culture through the lens of faith, this might be the Campfire Conversation for you.

As election season approaches, this is a good opportunity to remind everyone - Democrats and Republicans (and those of us who are neither) - that we want to keep Jesus in mind as we go to vote and remember that our love for Jesus and each other is greater than any political difference.

Keeping Connected

I would like to introduce myself to our congregation at St. Philip's Lutheran Church. I am Jeannie Evans and several of you are already familiar with me, from when me and my family joined the church several years ago. Some of you know me from being a foster mom. You will also see me sitting in the front pew on Sundays.



To give you a little update on my life, I have finally retired from foster care after 44 years. Now, I am learning to deal with the empty nest syndrome. Actually, Kasilu moved back home, so now it's just the two of us. For my own personal enjoyment, I bowl in a Women's Senior League on Tuesday mornings at Park Grove Bowl, and on Saturday mornings I coordinate the Junior Bowling League there too.

Forty-three years ago is when I was first introduced to the Lutheran religion. I helped a friend teach Sunday School and Vacation Bible School at Cross of Christ Lutheran Church in Welch. With the wonderful support of friends right here in our church family (who worked the details out of me with the help of my mom and shared lovingly with others within the church), they supported me and the family thru these months and the back surgery that I ended up having in late April. I am so grateful for all the people as stubborn as I, who wanted to help and showed up, even when not asked. From visits, to cards, to rides for kids, to the many prayers, it sure is humbling to feel that kind of love.

I am happy to report that I am back in full motion since mid-June and feeling great. God is so good!

Music for the concert includes familiar hymns, songs of praise, gospel selections and patriotic music. Come and enjoy an evening of stimulating music!


