

From the Epistle lesson for November 9, 2025

Bake / Soup / Quilt Sale

The calendar says November and that means the St. Philip's Bake/Soup/Quilt Sale will be taking place soon. Mark your calendars for Saturday, November 22 at 9 am to 12:30 pm at church.

There are several ways to be a part of this event: One more chance to help make lefse for the sale on Saturday, November 1 at 9 am.

1. Help is needed for soup making the day before the sale on Friday, November 21 starting at 9 am.
2. Help with setting up the bake sale and pricing of items on Friday, November 21
3. Contributing items to the sale.
4. Many hands are also needed the day of the sale.
5. Sign-up sheets are available in the narthex.

Four different kinds of soup will again be sold this year: Ham and Bean, Turkey and Wild Rice (both gluten free), Hamburger and Vegetable, and Chicken Taco. The soups will be takeout only quarts.

All donations to the sale such as home baked quick and yeast breads, cakes, pies, candy, snacks, cookies, bars, Scandinavian and Special Holiday items, home canned jam, jelly, pickles and fresh produce can be brought to church on Friday, November 21, 9 am to 7 pm or by 8:30 am on Saturday, November 22. Please wrap items attractively in clear plastic wrap and label the item. Include in the label important information such as gluten free, nuts or other food allergens.

Proceeds go toward Bible storybooks for 3-year-olds, Bibles for 3rd graders, a scholarship for a female student in Tanzania, Lutheran Social Service programs, and youth and church programs to name a few.

Beautiful quilts will also be sold on the same day as the Bake and Soup Sale made by the Do Days group.

Ministries beyond Hastings have included the Matrix Emergency Shelter in Dakota County, ELCA Domestic & International Response, My Very Own Bed, and mission congregations of the St. Paul Area Synod.

If YOU have an idea you would like to be included on the ballot at our next annual meeting, please let the pastor, church office or a council member know. The council will then decide on three local ministries and three broader ministries to be on the ballot at our December council meeting. The council has decided that three options in each category is a good number of possibilities.
